
Good luck to Year 11 Students





Media Students visit Harry Potter Studio Tour



On Thursday 3rd of May, Miss Wayman, Miss Boxer and Mr Healey took 36 media students from years 9, 10 and 11 to the Warner Brother's studio tour in Watford London. The purpose of the trip was for students to see how a media industry as big as Warner Brothers go about planning, producing and marketing a film as monumentally influential as **Harry Potter.** Furthermore, this knowledge is

crucial for the yr11 Media Studies GCSE on media industry.

We arrived around 11:30am and once inside, students were able to see the props, special effects, costumes and sets that were all involved in the films themselves. All students were fascinated with the areas of the tour but the aspects students were most over-whelmed by were the full sized replica of 'Diagon Alley,' the 'bigature' (big miniature) set of Hogwarts and being able to go one the three tiered 'KnightBus'. Students were even able to stand outside number 4 Privet Drive to have their photographs taken, as well as stop off to try some famous Butterbeer.

Despite coming home slightly early, all students found the tour worthwhile and exciting. From the results of the evaluation forms 100% of those students felt they had learned something about filmmaking and would not have improved the trip in any sense. A huge success for one of the first day trips in Media Studies and owing to the students' enthusiasm, more will be organised for the future.

6TH FORM @ THE BOURNE ACADEMY

Plans are well underway for our new 6th form, opening September 2013. This will give some of our students who are currently in Years 7-10 the opportunity to stay at the Academy at the end of year 11.

Housed in a brand-new, purpose-built block, our new 6th Form will be aspirational, relevant, and provide a high standard of education and support. Students will be able to choose from a number of courses in year 1, including various Engineering strands, A levels in Product Design, Art, Photography, Maths, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and a BTEC Level 3 in Performing



Arts. We will also be introducing a BTEC Level 3 in Outdoor education, in partnership with **Land and Wave**, a leading provider in this area. This course will be one of the first of its type in the UK, allowing students to study in a professional environment, achieve additional professional qualifications, and have extensive opportunities for work experience. The range of available courses will broaden in subsequent years.

All of our courses will have active links with Universities including **Bournemouth University**, **The Arts University College Bournemouth** and **University College**, **London** and employers, which will enable students to have a smooth transition into employment or degree programmes.

Media Students Visit Bournemouth University

On Wednesday 9th May, 12 year 10 Media Studies students visited Bournemouth University for a professional editing workshop.

Students arrived at the University and were impressed by the size of the campus and abundance of eateries! Students were escorted to the main media campus (Weymouth House) which conveys the professional equipment used by the media students there, as well as the number of recording studios. Students were allocated a new Apple Mac desktop and were tutored on how to create a music video via a software programme, Final Cut Pro. Final Cut Pro is used to edit most film & game trailers in the UK, as well as being widely used in the BBC, thus a very worthwhile workshop for students interested in these areas of the media.

All students expertly edited their music videos using the software and 100% of students stated on their evaluation forms that using the professional equipment was one of the most enjoyable features of the workshop.

Not only did this opportunity show students how Media is taught in Higher Education, but also conveyed to the students that their local university is one of the best in the country in regards to Media Studies.

A huge thank you to all the students involved who not only worked very professionally but were also very polite to the University staff.


audience. We have some very talented students in the Academy and this is a great opportunity to show off their talent to the local community. More information will be release in the next Newsletter about the following performances.
