# **Maths Star Challenge - Beebot**

Last term our Maths Stars from top set year 7 and 9 undertook a programming challenge using a basic floor robot – the Beebot.

Supported by Canford 6<sup>th</sup> Formers, the students had to find the <u>longest and</u> <u>most complex route</u> the Beebot could take, given a maximum of 40 commands.

Entries were then judged based on both the area and perimeter of the shape created, as well as the number of sides and how many of the 40 commands were used.




**Adam Ayles + Max Remington Liberal Democrats**

One student, Javier Monroy, initially struggled personally to come to terms with the party he was allocated. He said, "Since the moment I randomly selected UKIP, I was worried, as I personally didn't agree with what they offered. Sometimes, however, you just have to go along with things despite your personal feelings. At first, I found it quite difficult to represent UKIP's ideology, and found it especially challenging dealing with some vocal opposition made during my campaign trail, but as I delivered my second speech I became a bit more comfortable with it and by the end I enjoyed the task of trying to open people's minds and challenge their thinking."

Overall, the students found this mock election a positive and motivating experience. Adam Ayles stated, "It was a great experience, I was nervous at the start, however once I started to talk I became more confident and I am now very proud of what I have achieved." What's more, political awareness has spread to a much greater extent throughout year 10 and across the school. Rhea Stoke told us, "A week ago I didn't know much about the general election or politics in general. Now, I feel a lot more informed."



The **Green Party** secured a majority vote across the school's tutor groups and were ecstatic with the results. Logan Mellor claimed, "They say it's the taking part that counts, but having a majority vote feels pretty good too." Mrs Franklin and Mr Roberts both commented that they were exceptionally proud of all of the year 10s' achievements, however many tutor groups they had won. The funding will be used to renovate the Multi Use Games Area (MUGA). The total project will cost £85,000, and the Academy is now fundraising for the remaining £25,000




