

The DFE states:

“..is effective from 1 September 2013, requires schools to publish certain information on their websites. Where schools have received, or are receiving, year 7 catch-up premium funding, they are required to publish the following specified information about their use of the funding:

- how the school plans to spend the current academic year’s allocation
- how the school spent the previous academic year’s allocation. This must cover:
 - what effect the expenditure had on the educational attainment of those pupils at the school for whom the year 7 catch-up premium funding was allocated
 - how the school assessed the effect on attainment

Schools with year 7 pupils should be able to calculate fairly accurately what the new academic year’s allocation will be, once they receive information from feeder primary schools about pupils’ performance in the key stage 2 assessments. The government will allocate £500 in respect of each pupil who was at a maintained school in year 6 who has not attained level 4 in reading and/or mathematics (maximum £500 per pupil).”
