#### OFSTED 2019

The Bourne Academy is a welcoming and inclusive school. Pupils and staff are proud to be members of the school community. The views of many pupils are reflected in the comment made by one, who said, 'The school helps me to be the best version of myself.' The school is a calm place to learn. Pupils are respectful, friendly and polite. They look out for each other and look after the school environment. They feel safe and supported by school staff. Bullying is rare, and staff deal with it well. Staff model respectful behaviour and pupils respond positively. Leaders' ambition for pupils to aspire runs deeply throughout the school. # YOUR CHILD'S FIRST DAY – FAQs

#### 2021 Transition Day Date TBC

Due to the COVID 19 outbreak, we will contact parents/carers in regard to the transition programme. We are hopeful a transition event can go ahead in the summer term. The details of the start of term will be published on our website and parents/carers will receive communication from the Principal prior to September.

#### Where should students go on their first day?

Students should arrive via the Academy main entrance and make their way to the Lawn. Staff will be on the main doors to welcome students and will direct them through to the Lawn area.

#### What time should students arrive for?

Due to the COVID 19 outbreak, we will contact parents/carers with the details of your child's first day including a start time.

#### What do the students need to bring?

Please bring all items required for a normal school day: bag, clear pencil case, black/blue pen, green pen, ruler, rubber, pencil, calculator, PE kit and trainers. Your child should bring a packed lunch if they do not wish to purchase food from the school canteen. We use a cashless system in the canteen. Money should be uploaded onto your child's account in advance. Parents/carers will be notified of how to do this in due course.

#### What will students do on the first day?

Students will spend time with their tutor and learn about how their timetable will work on a daily basis. They will also experience some lessons and meet some of their teachers.

#### What happens at lunch?

Please bring either a packed lunch or money to purchase lunch from the canteen on the first day. Your child will not need money to purchase food if you have already put money on their online account. Year 7 will be given priority to access the canteen for the first week and will enter the canteen early to ensure that they feel comfortable and confident with the system. If students had free school meals at primary school, then we automatically get this information, and they will have their account credited online.

#### What will students study in each subject?

Please refer to the school website, using the 'Students' tab and then select the relevant 'area of learning'. You will be able to click on each subject and the Key Stage 3 curriculum outline will be viewable.

#### Is uniform required?

Full uniform must be worn. Please see the uniform guide within this booklet and details are on our website under the 'Parents' tab.

### FACTS, FIGURES & ENRICHMENT



- In 1937 two single-sex schools were built and in 1967 amalgamated to become Kingsleigh Secondary School. After major refurbishment in 2000, the school was re-named Kings High and in 2007, The Department for Education approached Canford School to become the sponsor.
- In September 2010, the newly renamed 'The Bourne Academy' opened.
- The Bourne Academy is an all-abilities state school for boys and girls aged 11 to 18 years old.
- The Academy's specialisms are Engineering & Design and English.
- Each House is run by a Head of House who offers pastoral care and support.
- Each House has several tutor groups of vertical ages. Each tutor group has a dedicated tutor.
- The Academy is set in over 23 acres of grounds, 6km north of Bournemouth Town Centre and the site includes sports fields, a MUGA with AstroTurf and floodlights, a wooded copse and a lake for Outdoor Education use.

- Black and pink knee length Academy skirt\* or black school trousers (not tight/stretchy material)
- Black socks or tights and plain black leather or leather look shoes (no/low heels, no trainers and no coloured decoration/logos)
- PE Kit Black & pink regulation Academy sports polo shirt \*, black shorts or track suit bottoms
- Dance kit—Black/purple/white t shirt with sleeves, black leggings or black tracksuit bottoms

- Visible facial piercings and stretcher earrings **are not allowed** and students will be asked to remove them.
- Trainers, hoodies and other outside garments are not to be worn in the Academy.

### **HOUSES & YEAR GROUPS**

<u>The House system</u> is named after the lighthouses standing at various points along the south coast, providing illumination, navigation and safe harbour for mariners and wayfarers. We at The Bourne Academy aspire to do likewise for all our students.

Every individual's needs and aspirations are important and the Academy seeks to value every child and adult associated with us. We aim to create a culture in which every person is treated with dignity and respect. The vertical House Tutor relationship is the foundation of the Academy's care, fostered by daily contact in tutorials. 

### MEDICAL

At The Bourne Academy, Mrs Copeline Irvine is our First Aid Lead who can be contacted by e-mail (<u>rachael.ci@thebourneacademy.com</u>) or by telephone 01202 528 554. Mrs Copelin Irvine and her team are able to treat minor injuries which inevitably happen from time to time. If your child becomes unwell at school and needs to go home, you will be contacted using the telephone number on your data collection form. Where possible, please give the school alternative numbers along with a mobile. Students' medication can be kept in a secure storage with arrangement with Mrs Copeline Irvine, students should not be carrying medication on their person and this should be handed to Reception, preferably by an adult. Children should not call home from their mobile phones if unwell.

# **STUDENT INFORMATION**

The Bourne Academy has a 'no mobile phone' policy, so please make sure that all mobile phones are switched off and kept in your child's bag during the school day. Headphones are also not permitted for use at school. Pupils should not bring valuables to school. Students are required to carry their belongings around with them during the school day, there are no lockers available. Therefore, please ensure your child's bag is robust and strong. Please ensure that all clothing, PE kit, coats are all named. This will ensure that any misplaced item can be returned directly to your child.

At the beginning of the academic year, students will be given a Student Planner book which will help them to plan their work. Parents are expected to monitor and sign Student Planners weekly. The Student Planner forms part of student's essential equipment.

The 'Show My Homework' app is used to record home learning tasks and submitting completed independent learning. Parents/carers will receive further information about this.

### **BEHAVIOUR POLICY**

#### Detentions

A teacher will give a student a Detention the next day or as arranged with parent/carer, if they:

- are sent to buddy
- have not given in homework

The teacher will put a reminder in the student's planner in the lesson to say when the Detention will be eg. after school, at break etc, and how long the Detention will be for. The Detention will focus on planning how the same thing will not happen again, eg how the student's attitude to learning will be different or how the student will make sure that homework is handed in on time.

#### **Punctuality to school**

Students who arrive late (without a pass eg. young carers) are placed in LOST (loss of social time) in C&E9 for break time the same day. If they do not attend, they will be put in lunch time LOST in C&E9. Non-attendance to both is sanctioned by the Head of House e.g. hour at the end of the day.

#### Late to lessons

If a student is late without good reason to a lesson, the class teacher will arrange for the student to make up the time in a break convenient to the teacher.

#### Breaking other rules in the Academy

If a student breaks everyone's right to a clean and hygienic environment, e.g. by chewing gum or dropping litter, they will do community service the next break or lunchtime, overseen by the Academy Facilities Manager. Member of staff tell student to report to Site Office next break/lunchtime.

If a student is defiant, e.g. walks out of a lesson, refuses to hand over a mobile phone or personal music device, they will be Green slipped. If the defiance continues the student may be excluded.

If a student is highly aggressive or threatening, swears at an adult, or completely destroys the learning of others, they will be excluded.

If a student swears in earshot of the adult taking the class, but not at another person, remind them of the Academy rule of respecting each other. If the student continues to do this, it will be seen as deliberate use of offensive language and the student will be excluded.


If a student fails to bring their planner to the Academy their tutor phones home and gives a planner sheet to the student. The tutor also gives a LOST (Loss Of Social Time) to the student for break that day – i.e. the student goes to a designated room for a supervised break detention. If they do not attend, they will attend LOST at lunch-time on the same day. Non-attendance to both is sanctioned by the Head of House (HOH) e.g. hour at the end of the day.

If a student misbehaves during social times e.g. boisterous behaviour, they should receive a warning. If they repeat the behaviour they should be taken/sent to LOST in the designated room. The HoH will monitor this behaviour. If poor behaviour continues, student will be in LOST for a given period of time. Poor behaviour in The Hub or on The Lawn e.g. leaving litter/refusing to put in bin, could result in a short-term ban from these areas.
