

CORONAVIRUS CATCH UP PREMIUM

The Government COVID-19 catch up premium is a one-off £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up for lost time after the school closurses between March and July 2020. This is especially important for students from the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds.

£650 million of this funding is being distributed directly to schools during the 2020/2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the financial support to help all students make up for lost teaching time. Schools are allocated funding at £80 per student in Years 7 - 11.

The Bourne Academy has been allocated funding totalling £68,720.
