CORONAVIRUS CATCH UP PREMIUM

The Government COVID-19 catch up premium is a one-off £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up for lost time after the school closures between March and July 2020. This is especially important for students from the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds.

£650 million of this funding is being distributed directly to schools during the 2020/2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the financial support to help all students make up for lost teaching time. Schools are allocated funding at £80 per student in Years 7 - 11.

The Bourne Academy has been allocated funding totalling £68,720.

Year 10 / 11	One on one tutoring in English and Maths using external tutors	Targeted support for specific students identified as having significant gaps in learning due to the extended school closure and ensuring that attainment is brought up to at least G4.	£18,000
Year 11	Subject specific tutor groups	Students are placed into subject specific led tutor groups based on analysis of their attainment over school closure to support in weakest areas. Tutor time extended to 45 minutes per day.	£0
KS 4	Tassomai subscription	Boost attainment in Science by providing learning platform and engage learners in independent study (extension of scheme used in prior years)	£1,500

KS 3	Academic mentoring support using the Teach First Academic Mentoring Programme	Provision of intensive learning support to identified students that have gaps in their learning to allow teachers to focus on delivering lessons. Salary is covered through the Government's National Tutoring Scheme, but the Academy pays the on-costs associated with this salary.	£2,900
Year 7	CATs Assessment in Year 7	Identify Year 7 students 'behind' in English and Maths	£1,850
Year 7	Separate group tuition on all subjects using Teaching Assistants for the Autumn 2020 terms for students that are at a significantly lower attainment level that expected.	To focus on students that have started secondary school significantly behind their peers in achievement and bring their attainment up to the level required for mainstream secondary education.	£8,060
Year 8	Small group tuition for selected students by HLTA for the Autumn 2020 term.	To focus on students that have fallen significantly behind their peers during the extended school closure across all subjects, with specific focus on Core, bringing their attainment up to expected levels.	£6,260
Year 7 / 8	Targeted small group Maths and English tuition outside of usual lessons for 2 hours per week	Targeted support for specific students that have significant gaps in their learning due to the extended school closure, ensuring that their attainment is brought back to at least expected levels.	£5,500
Year 8	Shine Project	Small group workshop sessions with students to support students with anxiety and mental health issues following lockdown	£500
KS3	Tutor time intervention lead by TAs in English and Maths	Focus on students that have a gap in their knowledge, ensuring that they catch up and cover any learning gaps as a result of the extended school closure.	£2,500

KS3	Extension of Lexonik reading programme	Widening the number of students who can participate on the programme. This allows for more students to improve reading and literacy skills, closing gaps in knowledge from the school closure.	£1,000
All Year groups	Additional Pastoral Support	Employment of additional staff to support current pastoral team with increased numbers of students with SEMH and anxiety issues. Students feel more confident and comfortable in attending school.	£16,900
Year 7 - 10	Purchasing of wider reading books and texts for tutor reading programme	Students are exposed to greater number of words and challenging texts. The teacher ensures correct pronunciation and provides synonyms for words that students might not have come across. This is to improve tier 2 vocabulary levels. Tutor time extended to allow increased focus on the programme.	£2,000
All Year groups	Purchase of mini whiteboards for classrooms	To allow for formative assessment and to ensure that learning gaps are identified and addressed through responsive teaching	£1,000
All Year groups	Purchase of additional visualisers for classrooms	To allow for high quality teaching and learning across all areas of the Academy; allows effective modelling and appropriate practice sharing.	£750
