Having taken place for 140 years, entries are received from all 56 countries across the Commonwealth. The competition asked entrants to explore the power young people hold within the global community and consider how this power can be harnessed to make a meaningful impact in the world. The Bourne Scholars competed against thousands of entries with 'only a handful' receiving Silver and Bronze awards. Incredibly, six of our Scholars received Bronze or Silver certificates.
