Year 7	Arts and Wellbeing: AWE Team Day Uniform: PE Kit
	Students will spend the day on ASPIRE projects within the Visual and Performing Arts as well as
	ASPIRE challenges with the PE Team. The day will also encourage students to take up ACE
	opportunities throughout the year.
Year 8	Skills Builder: Operation Moonbase Standard Academy Uniform
	Students will build a new society on a distant moon called Utopia, including selecting who will be
	the first citizens, creating an animal that will help people and building a 3D model of a new city.
Year 9	Skills Builder: Criminal Justice System Day Standard Academy Uniform
	Students will build a deep understanding of the UK criminal justice system through exploring a
	fictional case of a young man's attempt to appeal his conviction. Through a range of tasks students
	will develop the skills of evaluating evidence for validity, a familiarity with the roles and processes
	of the Crown Court and be given opportunities to participate in mock trials.
Year 10	My Working Future – Part One Standard Academy Uniform
	During the day, students will explore their individual strengths and talents as they begin preparing
	for the world of work. Working with SUN, an external careers organisation, they will learn how to
	create a professional CV ready for their upcoming work experience placements later in Year 10.
	Students will also investigate a variety of job roles and employer profiles, helping them to
	understand what different careers involve and how to present themselves confidently to potential
	employers.
Year 11	My Working Future – Part Two Standard Academy Uniform
	Year 11 students will begin the day with an insightful talk from the Department for Work and
	Pensions, exploring up-to-date labour market information and emerging career opportunities.
	They will then analyse a range of job descriptions and vacancies, identifying the key details and
	skills employers look for when recruiting. Later in the day, students will focus on preparing for
	apprenticeship or job interviews—learning how to present themselves with confidence and
	understanding the importance of networking by identifying who is already part of their own
	professional network and how they can expand it further.

Year 12	Independent Futures
	Students will complete a programme of three sessions throughout the day which will include Basic First Aid with resources from St John's Ambulance, as well as a practical cooking skills session where students will learn and apply basic cooking techniques. Students will also complete a Personal Finance session to support them manage their budgets and personal finances for both now, and in the future.
Year 13	Independent Study – Reading Day
