RECORD NUMBERS VISIT ACADEMY OPEN EVENING

In September, our annual Open Evening was a resounding success with record numbers of prospective families viewing the school. Despite heavy rain and flash floods people arrived in force to see the extensive and professional facilities, meet and talk with the staff, and to listen to Mr Avoth's first Open Day address as Principal of the Academy.

Throughout the evening numerous activities were open to visitors; there were experiments in Science, savoury bites in Food, Dance, Drama and Music Workshops and the 6th Form's National Green Power car in Engineering. Outdoor Education was also very popular with a climbing wall available for budding climbers! Every subject on the curriculum was on display and available for all to see.

Members of staff were available to answer parents' questions and the Academy's Bourne Leaders (*the Academy's prefects*) were also available to give tours around the modern and colourful buildings. Principal, Mark Avoth, and several students, gave two very strong speeches, highlighting the ethos and values of the Academy as well as views on attendance, uniform, pastoral care, aspirations and high expectations.



Initial feedback from parents highlighted 'the happy feeling' around school and how well 'staff and students interact'. Overall, parents and children left 'feeling inspired' and had an 'amazing experience'. Out of all the guests surveyed on the night, 99% of visitors said they were either definitely choosing The Bourne Academy or tempted to come. MAASAI WARRIORS RETURN TO ACADEMY

In October, seven members from the **Osiligi Maasai Warriors** performed for students and staff at The Bourne Academy. They performed authentic, traditional Kenyan songs and showed how they herd their cattle with special chants and whistles. Their speciality is jumping four feet in the air, from standing position, and soon had students and teachers joining in.

The group work in close association with a small UK charity, Osiligi Charity Projects, who support the infrastructural improvements in their local community. In 2012 a primary school, the Osiligi Obaya Academy, was opened. On their last visit in 2011, the Warriors were presented with the Academy pink and black uniform, which they are now using as their own village school colours.



In 2015, the Academy presented them with eight more crates of second hand uniform for their students.

Local schools are very poor and although primary education in Kenya is compulsory, it is not free. State schools have many extra charges, which results in many children never attending school. This school built in rural Olepolos, is therefore an excellent stepping stone to education for all children.




Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths Numeracy and i-Media

The Autumn term has been a busy time in the TED department. Year 7 students have been encouraged to make the most of the department's extensive facilities and have been practicing both modern and traditional manufacturing techniques.

Students have worked with metal and wood – producing key rings, pendants and trinket boxes – all of which make perfect stocking fillers! Lessons in Electronics have given students the opportunity to build working torches and Computer Aided Design (CAD) has enabled them to get to grips with the famed TED laser printer.





In **Year 8** the challenges varied from building load-bearing cranes to constructing amplifier circuits to designing perfume bottles.

Year 9 students have built desk fans, designed buildings of the future, experimented with mechanical linkages and created their own flat-pack furniture.

GCSE Product Design students from Year 11 are making excellent progress with their coursework and have impressed the TED department with the originality of their designs and the quality of their craftsmanship.


The Greenpower F24 (Year 7-11) team are making significant advances with

The Parent Zone was founded in 2005 and has a track record of providing information, support and advice to parents. In recent years, The Parent Zone's work has focused on the impact of digital technologies on families. We provide information, resources and training for parents and those who work with them.

CEOP is the child protection command of the National Crime Agency. CEOP reaches over three million children and young people a year through its 'thinkuknow' education programme and regularly conveys its vital online safety messages to over 100,000 practitioners (such as social workers, teachers and police officers) registered to their network, who cascade these messages directly to children and young people.
