All students thoroughly enjoyed the day and gained a real insight into a world of Engineering possibilities and opportunities.


The Academy are now looking to enter a team from the GCSE Engineering group into a regional robotic competition in the Autumn, so watch this space!





We are currently reviewing the number of students who are eligible for free school meals.

Parents / carers in receipt of one or more of the following benefits may be entitled to claim:

- **Income Support**
- Income-Based Job Seeker's Allowance
- An income-related employment and support allowance
- Support Under Part VI of the Immigration & Asylum 1999
- Child Tax Credit, provided that you are NOT entitled to Working Ta Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenues and Customs) that does not exceed £16,190 @ March 2012
- The Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit.

You are encouraged to apply for FSM a this also helps the Academy to qualify for extra funding. If the Academy is aware that you are eligible for FSM, there could be benefits for you in the future through other funding schemes.
