Why we give our students Knowledge Organisers

Knowledge Organisers will give your children:

- Vital information that underpins learning the 'must knows' of their curriculum
- Reduction in cognitive load because they have committed the 'must know' knowledge to memory, their working memories are freer to take on new learning
- Particularly useful for closing 'knowledge gaps' that may have been caused by lockdown
- Practise with independent learning/revision
- Support with literacy development: helping them to master relevant Tier 2 language (extended vocabulary) and Tier 3 language (subject specific vocabulary).
- Preparation for GCSE and A Level learning and revision

How we help our students use their Knowledge Organisers

- Every student issued with a bound booklet of their Autumn term curriculum (repeated every term)
- They are **saved on Show My Homework**, our digital platform for setting assignments and saving resources
- They will be saved on the TBA website
- A tutor programme teaching students why we use them and how best to use them both in lessons and at home
- Every class teacher supports their students with reminders of why we use them and how best to use them



How we help our students use their Knowledge Organisers

HOW DO WE REVISE WITH OUR KNOWLEDGE ORGANISERS?

RECORD IT

Record yourself on your phone or tablet reading out the information. These can be listened to as many times as you want!



BACK 2 FRONT

Write down the answers and then write out what the questions 'the teacher may ask to get those answers.



POST ITS

Using a pack of post it notes, write out as many of the keywords or dates as you can remember in 1 minute!



TEACH IT!

Teach someone your key facts and then get them to test you, or even test them!



HIDE AND SEEK

Read through your Knowledge Organiser, put it down and try and write out as much as you can remember. Then keep adding to it until it is full.



PRACTICE

Some will remember knowledge by simply writing the facts, over and over again.



FLASH CARDS

Write the keyword / date on one side and the explanation on the other. Ask someone to quiz you on either side.



SKETCH IT

Draw pictures to represent the facts or dates. It could be a simple drawing or something that reminds you of the answer.



READ ALOUD

Simply speak the facts and dates out loud as you're reading the Knowledge Organiser. Even try to act out some of the facts – it really helps you remember.
